8th International Interpretative Policy Analysis conference (IPA)

The 8th International Interpretative Policy Analysis conference (IPA) takes place in Vienna (AT) from 3-5 July 2013 (see https://ipa2013.univie.ac.at/home/). It is organized by the Department of Political Science at the University of Vienna together with the Life-Science-Governance Research Platform (LSG), the Austrian Political Science Association (ÖGPW), the Department of social Studies of Science at the University of Vienna and the Institute of Forest, Environmental, and Natural Resource Policy at the University of Natural Resources and Life Sciences Vienna (BOKU). The main conference theme is: "Societies in Conflict: Experts, Publics and Democracy".

C & I project

The program includes besides keynote speeches, a set of round table meetings, authors meet critics sessions, methodology workshops and about 66 topical panels that deal with various issues in relation to the conference topic. Besides so-called "practice seminars" where scientists are supposed to interact with politics are organized. One of those practice seminars will deal with "European Forest Governance" that has been particularly studied by an international team of forest policy analysts in the wake of a ThinkForest study.
