## FACESMAP COST Action – 6<sup>th</sup> WG meeting

The Faculty of Forestry, University of Agriculture in Krakow organised the **6<sup>th</sup> Working Group meeting of the FP1201 FACESMAP COST Action** from 4–6 November 2015 in Krakow, Poland.

On the day before the meetings, **Early Stage Researchers** (ESR) group organised a **colloquium**, where young researchers presented draft papers and got comments and recommendations from senior researchers from the Action. This proved to be a very useful tool for ESRs, and it will be repeated during the next Action meeting.

The meeting was dedicated mainly to sub-groups and task-groups work, and as a start of the synthesis process, which will be in the focus during the next meeting.

In the frame of the “Travellab” activities, a field trip and a regional stakeholder workshop (“carousel”) was organised on the second day of the meeting. In the field trip to **Tatra National Park** and **Community of 8 Entitled Villages in the Witów district** of the Tatra Mountains, the participants learnt about private forestry in Poland, and more specifically about the common forest ownership type, which is the most typical type of ownership in this part of the Poland.

## Concepts, methods and findings in forest ownership research in Europe – Mid-term Proceedings of the COST Action FP1201

The **Mid-term Proceedings of the COST Action FP1201 (FACESMAP)** cover a broad range of topics related to the forest ownership change. It has the aim to present some of its first findings to a wider audience. The published papers have been produced during the first two years of the Action, and are the result of various interactions and tools implemented in the Action, such as meetings, training school and short term scientific missions. ## The 7<sup>th</sup> StarTree General Assembly meeting in Hamburg

The **7<sup>th</sup> StarTree General Assembly** took place in Krummendeich, Lower Saxony, **Germany** from **11–13 November 2015**. The project partners met to discuss project progress and exchange, especially about Regional Case Studies as they were presented in a new light and with more possibility for discussion than has been possible at previous meetings.

During the first meeting day, the **StarTree innovation generator** was presented as a common process amongst the action research groups and all partners. Innovation support workshops and innovation cases workshops were facilitated by Gerhard Weiss (BOKU) and Christine Fischer (FORECO/CTFC) in order to carry out the work on the innovation tools (innovation generator) during the coming third StarTree project period.

The entire second meeting day was dedicated to be a “regional case day”. The issues presented were particularly relevant for cross-case learning and inter-linking between the case studies. The results will feed the content for project outcomes and dissemination activities.

The third meeting day focused on preparing and planning all dissemination activities for the third StarTree project phase. Furthermore, the results of the research in all StarTree work packages from the first two project periods were presented and discussed in plenary. Finally, **the next General Assembly meeting which will take place in Wales in April 2016** was introduced.

## FOREST EUROPE 7<sup>th</sup> MINISTERIAL CONFERENCE

The **7<sup>th</sup> Ministerial Conference on the Protection of Forests in Europe (MCPFE)** was held in **Madrid, Spain**, from **20–21 October 2015**, followed by the Extraordinary Ministerial Conference (EMC) on 21 October. The former reviewed FOREST EUROPE work since the 6<sup>th</sup> MCPFE held in 2011 in Oslo, Norway and decided on work going forward, while the EMC received the results of the work of the Intergovernmental Negotiating Committee for a Legally Binding Agreement on Forests in Europe. About 220 participants attended the Conferences, including ministers responsible for forests and other high-level representatives of 38 European countries and the European Union, as well as representatives of 17 observer organizations, including EFI. EFI's Director Marc Palahí addressed future challenges and opportunities of the European forests and forest-based sector and made a strong statement on the future importance of European forest research.

The Ministerial Conference adopted: a **Ministerial Declaration “25 Years Together Promoting Sustainable Forest Management in Europe”**, a decision on the future direction of FOREST EUROPE and two resolutions, one on ‘Forest Sector in the Center of a Green Economy,’ the other on ‘Protection

of Forests in a Changing Environment’. The EMC adopted a decision agreeing to explore possible ways to find common ground on the draft legally binding agreement at an appropriate time no later than 2020.

Besides “The State of Europe's Forests Report 2015” and a report on the national and pan-European implementation of FOREST EUROPE commitments, a **“Mid-term evaluation of the Goals for European Forests and the European 2020 Targets for Forests”** was published. It was authored by Stefanie Linser and Bernhard Wolfslehner from EFICEEC.


on the role of forest policy research and its uptake in policy-making in the region. The documents will serve as a reference for research planning and designing a science-policy interface in the future.
